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# 1 - Involving the user

E-paper projects

- **Social shaping of technology**
  - Users and engineers ≠ way of looking at technology  
-> technology failures
  - Consumer decides if and how he appropriates the technology
  - Developing and adoption is a dynamic process influenced by social changes and context are influencing each other

## 2 - E-paper

- Introduction
  - E-reader with e-ink
  - 200 test users
  - Test during 2,5 months (Apr-Jun)
  - Living lab configuration
    - Using real users in their natural context
    - Observe in their natural, daily behaviour
    - User is a co-producer in the innovation process



# Strengths and weaknesses

E-paper projects

Strengths	Weaknesses
Screen quality	Operation of the device needs to be more intuitive
Screen size	Battery life span
Compactness of device	Presentation of newspaper on the device
Look of device	Vulnerability
Opportunities	Threats
Multiple titles (newspapers, books, magazines)	Competition with other portable devices (PDA, smart phone)
Zoom able formats	Habit of reading the daily newspaper (old habits die hard)
Books on vacation	
Reading device with acrobat reader or integrated devices (agenda, e-mail)	
Foldable screens	

# Research results

E-paper projects

- Positioning in news landscape
  - **Habit** of regular newspaper
    - Similar lay-out + content
    - Similar navigation + options
  - **Low interest** in personalized content + RSS feeds
  - Ideal **holiday tool**: store books and download newspapers
  - **Practical** for reading newspapers on the move

## Research results II

E-paper projects

- Positioning among existing mobile devices
  - specific focus on **reading functionality**
  - ≠ opinions:
    - Multiple portable devices -> all-in-one PDA
    - Only reading functionality -> read multiple newspapers + PDF documents (instead of printing)

# Conclusion

- Old habits die hard
  - in the short run, the eReader will not replace the real newspaper
  - No new user practices -> substitute for existing platform & practices
- Innovation through familiarity
  - eReader perceived as new + additional channel to receive the existing newspaper
  - 49% of panel members indicate they would want a perfect functioning eReader in the future



## 3 - Me-Paper

E-paper projects

- **Introduction**
  - five Dutch **newspapers** (local-regional-national)
  - two research **institutes**: EC/DC and IBBT
  - **general objective**
    - setting up a development lab for the design of journalistic formats
    - the establishment of a living lab for parallel continuous user testing
  - **technology**
    - Ultra Mobile PCs
    - e-Ink mounted readers (iLiad)

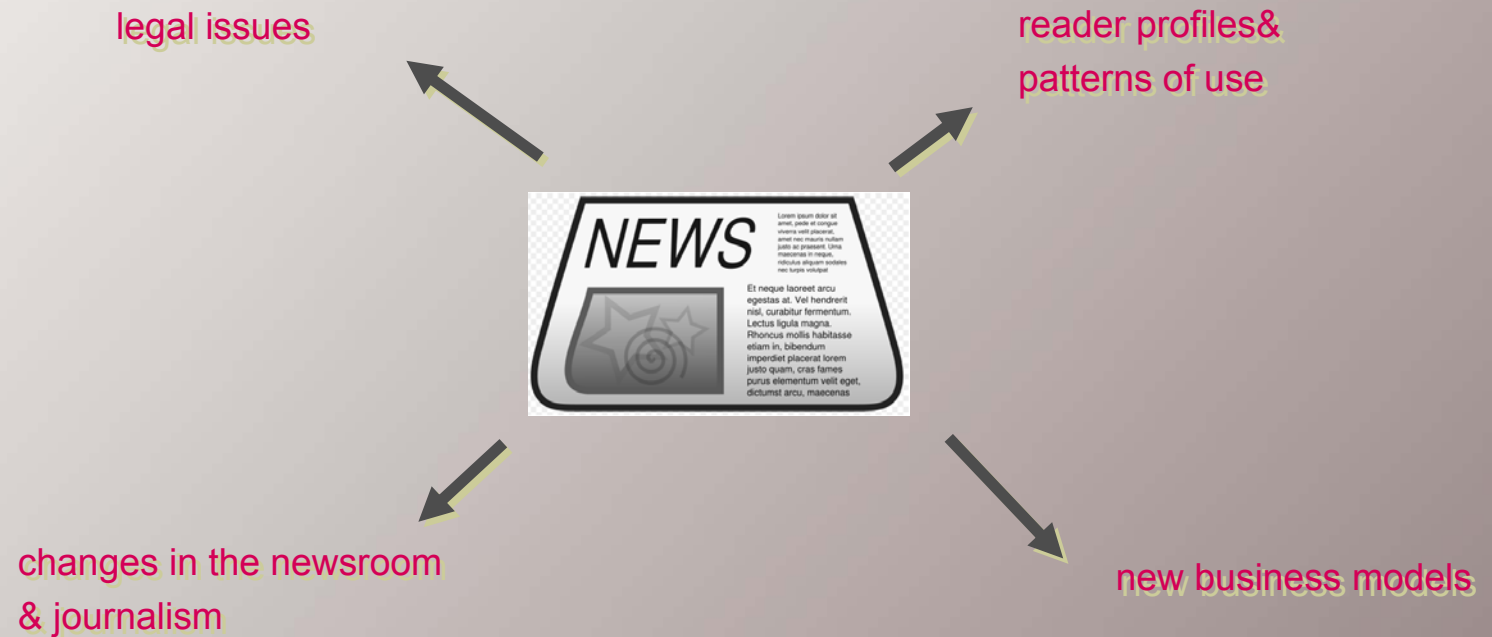
# Me-paper

E-paper projects

- **process**
  - **brainstorms**: news provision in 2012
  - **concepts**: priorities, choices, sketches
  - **paper prototypes / low fidelity**
    - user evaluation
  - **prototypes / high fidelity**  
(both iLiad and UMPC)
    - user evaluation
  - **new services participating papers**

# FLEET

E-paper projects

- on **production** side
  - identification and inventarisation of actors, products and services
  - business models of e-publishing
- on **content** [generating] side
  - the position and role of the journalistic profession: work organisation, task division and function descriptions in digital newsrooms
  - the education and training of journalists: new skills and competences for digital journalists
- on **user** side
  - identification of user profiles and patterns
  - P2P and e-publishing: the 3P-project (Public Publishing Platform)
- **transversal** issues
  - future of e-publishing
  - legal implications

- Production side:
  - database of Flemish (e)Publishing actors: to be launched soon
  - Business models to be presented at workshop in December 2007
- Content side:
  - Results of three months participatory research at Flemish newspaper to be released soon
